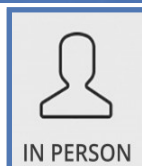

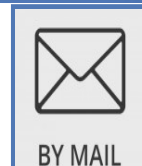

Explanation of Addition to Mission Statement

The Joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. With these words Pope Francis invites people to embark upon a new chapter of evangelization marked by this joy (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 1).

Bring Christ to All. Coming together with a mission that was simple yet filled with meaning was our primary goal as we at Blessed Trinity renewed our commitment to the continued efforts of evangelization. We are happy that we have been able to make it a part of our identity.

The pandemic has posed many challenges in the lives of all individuals and families and in the life of the Church. Guided by the Holy Spirit, Blessed Trinity was able to bring Christ to people who needed Him in times of confinement, loneliness, and uncertainty. We are thankful to God for using all of us as instruments to fulfill our mission.

Bring Christ to All and All to Christ. When one reads the gospels there are many people, who wanted to encounter Jesus: the leper who approached him asking to be cleansed (Mt 8:1-4); the two blind men who followed him crying out "Son of David have pity on us" (Mt 9:25); Zacchaeus who climbed a tree to see Jesus pass by (Luke 19:1-9); the Syrophoenician woman who begged Jesus to drive the demon out of her daughter (Mk 7:26), among many others who came to Jesus. They all had one thing in common; somebody brought the Good News of Jesus Christ to them, so in turn they desired to meet him in person.

It's been more than one year since we reopened the Church after weeks of lock down, and an adaptation to a new reality in our lives and the life of the Church. We realize that we need to continue to bring Christ to all and also bring all to Christ, bring them back to the life of the parish, to the sacraments, to spiritual growth through the different ministries, to a life of prayer in community. True faith in the incarnate Son of God is inseparable from self-giving, from membership in the community, from service, from reconciliation with others (*EG*, 88).

As we continue to welcome each and every parishioner back to Blessed Trinity, it is critical that we bring them to Christ. For, "The Lord does not disappoint those who take this risk; whenever we take a step towards Jesus, we come to realize that he is already there, waiting for us with open arms" (*EG*, 3). *For those who have been here before, He is here for you. For those that are new, He is here for you. Christ is here with open arms for each of us. We want to welcome all to the home of Christ the King who loves us.*

We will begin to incorporate our new addition to our mission statement and pray it resounds with each of you as it does with us. It will be the compass that will guide us to continue bringing the hope of Jesus Christ to all and experience the Joy of the Gospel, which fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus.

Explicación de la Adición a Nuestra Misión

La alegría del Evangelio llena el corazón y la vida de todos los que se encuentran con Jesús. Con estas palabras el Papa Francisco invita a las personas a emprender una nueva etapa evangelizadora marcada por esta alegría. (Evangelii Gaudium, 1).

Lleva a Cristo a todos. Unirnos con una misión que era simple pero llena de significado fue nuestro objetivo principal, ya que en Blessed Trinity renovamos nuestro compromiso con los continuos esfuerzos de evangelización. Estamos felices de haberlo hecho parte de nuestra identidad.

La pandemia ha planteado muchos desafíos en la vida de todas las personas y familias y en la vida de la Iglesia. Guiada por el Espíritu Santo, Blessed Trinity pudo llevar a Cristo a las personas que lo necesitaban en tiempos de confinamiento, soledad e incertidumbre. Agradecemos a Dios por usarnos a todos como instrumentos para cumplir con nuestra misión.

Lleva a Cristo a todos y todos a Cristo. The Solemnity Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary - August 15, 2021

WHAT IS THE ASSUMPTION?

The first name of this solemnity was the Feast of Mary, Mother of God. Later, its name in the East carried over, the Dormition (or Falling Asleep) of Mary. In the West, it became known as the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

This solemnity celebrates the fact that Mary's Assumption is "a pledge of the future participation of the members of the mystical Body of Christ in the paschal glory of the Risen Christ." It shows that the Lord "reserves a munificent reward for his humble Servant because of her faithful cooperation with the divine plan, which is a destiny of fullness, happiness, glorification of her immaculate soul, her virginal body, perfect configuration to her Risen Son" (Directory, no. 180). The Mass has a proper vigil, and the solemnity replaces the Mass of the day when it occurs on a Sunday in Ordinary Time.

What does this all mean?

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII declared the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which the Church celebrates every year on August 15. Simply put, the dogma of the Assumption states that at the end of her life, the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken, body and soul, into Heaven.

While this event isn't reflected in Sacred Scripture, it is clearly part of the Church's earliest observance. In the sixth century, St. John Damascene wrote in one of his sermons, "Your sacred and happy soul, as nature will have it, was separated in death from your most blessed and immaculate body, and although the body was duly interred, it did not remain in the state of death, neither was it dissolved by decay; your most pure and sinless body was not left on earth, but you were transferred to your heavenly throne."

Theologically speaking, death is often understood to be a consequence of original sin. Since Mary was conceived without Original Sin, some theologians have wondered if Mary died or if perhaps she was taken into Heaven without experiencing death. The Catechism of the Catholic Church doesn't answer this question but simply states, "The most blessed Virgin Mary, when the course of her earthly life was completed, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven" (no. 974)

The Solemnity of the Assumption reminds us of the unique role that Mary served in the process of our salvation. Although she was without sin, we have the possibility of receiving God's forgiveness for our sins through Christ. Her entry into Heaven prefigures our own hope of experiencing the same eternal life.

Ordinarily, the celebration of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a holy day of obligation for Catholics, but when it falls on a Saturday or a Monday, that obligation to attend Mass is lifted.

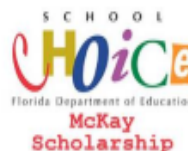
